New Online Banking Transfer Details

There is a new tool on the SPS website which lets you create a reference to use in online bank transfers to prison accounts. This will ensure the money reaches the prison account faster and more securely.

- If you do online banking at the moment you can just update your current details with the new reference number.
- > The prison account and sort code remain the same.
- To use this online tool you need to know the prisoner number and date of birth of your intended recipient.
- Go to the SPS website <u>www.sps.gov.uk/Corporate/News/News-7214.aspx</u>
- > You will see a box like the one below:

1. Enter Prisioner Number			
	Confirm	dd/mmVyyyy	Confirm

First enter the prisoner number and press "confirm", and then select their date of birth from the calendar picker.



- > When you click confirm, your new reference number will be shown.
- The number will look like this format 123456-01/01/1970 This is the reference number you need to use when making an online bank transfer. Keep a note of this number.
- Login to your online banking account and choose to set up a new payee (or amend the current one you have setup)
- > Use the following account number and sort code for the new payee:

Account name: Scottish Prison Service Prisoner Funds Central

Account no: 21170685

Sort Code: 83-06-08

In the reference box type in your new reference number.

Your bank may not let you use characters such as '/' or '-' in the reference box.
If this is the case remove the '-' and replace with a space.
You can also remove the '/' from the date of birth so that it is 8 numbers

e.g. reference number could look like 123456 01011970

- Make sure that you do not include a space before the reference number or at the end.
- Save the payee.
- That's it. Your payee in your online banking is now correctly setup to receive your money each and every time you use this payee, whilst they are in custody. £50 maximum bank transfer.
- Please note, payments from non-UK banks are not permitted.
